The bulk of the 246-page handwritten document was written in 1869, and is a history of the Bell and Gell families. Much of the narrative takes place in Durham, predominantly around the village of Brancepeth. The document is rich with genealogical information, local description, and anecdote, predominantly of the nineteenth century, but reaching as far back as the seventeenth.
